4	Supporting the emergency services	OOS reported it would be useful to identify opportunities for partnership work with the Ambulance service and in particular to explore the potential for volunteers to support the service by providing on-call specially trained volunteers who could provide practical support, especially to older people, in non-emergency situations, to avoid hospital admission.
